

Texas Rig

Probably the most effective and most utilized way to catch bass by tournament anglers is to be using a texas rigged worm or tube. This rig will allow you to fish in heavy cover without getting snagged or tied up in the weeds. Bass often lay in some of the heaviest cover especially during the daylight hours to protect from light and to ambush their prey. To get to these bass nothing is better than a texas rigged worm or tube.

1. Sinker - The sinker is called a worm weight and varies in weight. If casting your texas rigged bait out and working back you'll want to use a lighter weight. If you are flipping or pitching into heavy cover you may want to choose a heavier weight to get through the cover.
2. Put the sinker on the line pointed side up
3. Tie on an off set hook 3/0 works best for tubes and 1/0 works best for finesse style worms and a 2/0 works great for standard plastic worms. If you are using a large worm you may want to use a 4/0 hook.
4. Put the hook through the top of the tube or worm and pull all the way through



5. Next turn the hook 180 degrees



6. Finally put the hook back into the tube or worm making sure the lure is perfectly straight
